Coiste Forbartha na Carraige are an elected group of people representing the area of Carrick. The District comprises the following townlands: Meenaveen, Creeveen, Meenawaughran, Carrick Upper, Carrick Lower and the Carrick settlement area. The Carrick Settlement area includes the houses in the Parish of Kilcar on the Bogagh Road and the Line Road to the farthest extent of the football field.

Purpose (from our constitution)

Our main role is to represent our community with voluntary groups, local authorities and other state or semi-state organisations. Our aim is to enhance the quality of life for our community by developing and maintaining infrastructure, services and activities to promote social and economic improvement. Our objectives are to: Work with local parish councils and development committees, promote and improve services in the Carrick area and wider region, maintain and enhance social services in our community, facilitate job creation and job maintenance, encourage business to locate in our area. Develop public infrastructure and ensure that existing facilities are properly maintained, encourage and organise educational activities, encourage environmental awareness and best practice and organise campaigns for the advancement of our area or region.

Some of the projects the Coiste have been involved with since 2019 include:

The creation of a children's playground and Outdoor Adult Gym

The Development of Carrick Riverwalk including the extension, funded through the Town & Village renewal scheme

The reconstruction of the footbridge following the destruction of the old bridge in October 2019 as a result of storm Lorenzo (The Seamus Mc Ginley Bridge)

The Health Check and Regeneration Strategy for Carrick. Launch of the document An Charraig 2040 on 6th March 2024

It is hoped that the regeneration strategies outlined in this document will help drive development and employment opportunities in the area in addition to providing the facilities and amenities in our community.
